East Central Elementary's GOALS:

- 1. East Central Elementary School will improve academic achieve ment in Math and Reading by increasing the percentage of kindergarten through second grade students who score on or above grade level by 3% as measured by the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment from 2018 to 2019.
- 2. East Central Elementary School will improve academic achievement in Engl ish/La nguage Arts (ELA) and Math by increasing the percentage of third through sixth grade students who score proficient or above by 3% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment (GMA) from 2018 to 2019.

- K Phonics & mastery of sight words; Identification & use of numbers within 20; Add and subtract within 10
- 1 Reading for fluency & comprehension; Add & subtract within 20; compose and decompose numbers
- 2 Reading for fluency & comprehension; Writing in complete sentences; using number concepts to solve problems
- 3 Reading for fluency, comprehension, & response; multiplying & dividing whole numbers; geometry
- 4 Citing evidence & making inferences from texts; adding, subtracting, multiplying, & dividing multi-digit numbers
- 5 Comparing multiple texts using literary structures; adding, subtracting, multiplying, & dividing fractions & decimals
- 6 Analyzing texts & citing evidence to support answers; Understanding & applying math problem solving
