

# RHS JROTC finishes round one of CyberPatriot competition



Congratulations to the Rome High School Junior Reserve Officer's Training Corps (JROTC) as they recently finished Round One of the CyberPatriot competition.

CyberPatriot is the National Youth Cyber Education Program, where at the center of CyberPatriot is the National Youth Cyber Defense Competition.

The Wolves scored a 198.02 out of 220 possible points. They finished #1 in State for the All Service Division, were overall in the All Service Division placing 101 out of 1104 (Top 10%), and for all High School Divisions, 679/3502 (Top 20%).

Good luck to the JROTC Wolves as they prepare for Round Two of the CyberPatriot Competition in December. They will also be competing at State in January, Semi's in February and Finals in April.

"The National Youth Cyber Defense Competition puts teams of high school and middle school students in the position of newly hired IT professionals tasked with managing the network of a small company.

In the rounds of competition, teams are given a set of virtual images that represent operating systems and are tasked with finding cybersecurity vulnerabilities within the images and hardening the system while maintaining critical services in a six hour period.

Teams compete for the top placement within their state and region, and the top teams in the nation earn all-expenses paid trips to Baltimore, MD for the National Finals Competition where they can earn national recognition and scholarship money."
